ICUAS'19 CLE LEGAL TRACK - SUMMARY & AGENDA

To follow up on the success our last year's inaugural CLE Legal Track for **attorneys, policy makers, legal practitioners** and **industry stakeholders in the UAS community**, the ICUAS '19 conference is again offering a **one-day only** separate track on **regulations, policy, legal, and ethical issues** related to UAS/drone technologies, in the U.S. and internationally. The Legal Track will parallel and leverage the companion multi-day ICUAS'19 Technical Program (June 11-14, 2019).

The conference anticipates seeking between **7.0 CLE Credit Hours** (General In-Person) depending on jurisdictional requirements. Current states from which CLE will be sought include **Georgia** (other states upon request).
